

Rethores and Strategoi in Fourth-Century Athens

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CONCERNING POLITICAL LEADERSHIP in classical Athens historians have posed a number of interesting questions: Were the Athenian ‘politicians’ recruited from the propertied families? Did they become rich in consequence of their political careers? Did they belong to the city demes or to the inland and coastal demes? Did they often serve as *archai* selected by lot? How often were they put on trial? But as a basis for their arguments historians tend either to draw up a random list of so-called politicians or to adduce five, ten, or fifteen examples of named political leaders, from which to draw conclusions.¹ In the absence of a list of political leaders, this is of course the only possible method, and doubtless the answers offered are often along the right lines. Nevertheless, given the very good sources available on fourth-century Athens, it is worth while to delimit the concept ‘political leader’ and accordingly draw up a list of persons meeting the criteria, so as to have a more rigorous basis for addressing questions of the sort mentioned above. In an earlier article² I argued that in fourth-century Athens the phrase *ρήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί* is the nearest equivalent of what we, with a much vaguer and less formal term, call ‘politicians’ or ‘political leaders’. Accordingly, I present here the application of that principle, an inventory which is basically a list of *rethores* and *strategoi*. First however it is necessary to discuss whom to include and why.

In recording the *strategoi* I include only members of the Athenian board of ten and omit the generals who commanded the forces on Samos, Skyros, Lemnos, and Imbros.³ But of the elected military officials, the *strategoi* were only first in rank: why not include the hipparchs, taxiarchs, and phylarchs? There is some slight evidence that taxiarchs or hipparchs might be reckoned among the political leaders. Describing the oligarchic revolution of 404, Lysias mentions τοὺς τοῦ δήμου προεστηκότας καὶ στρατηγοῦντας καὶ τοὺς ταξι-*αρχοῦντας* (13.7, cf. also 26.20), and Xenophon advises a hipparch to collaborate with the *rhetores* in the council (*Hipp.* 1.8). There is however a substantial gulf between these scattered remarks and the constant juxtaposition of *rhetores* and *strategoi*, and our prosopographical knowledge does not support the inclusion of the other elected officers.⁴ Of 39 known fourth-century hipparchs, taxiarchs, and phylarchs, three, completing the ‘*cursus honorum*’, came to be *strategoi* and are accordingly recorded in this capacity. But only two are known also as *rhetores* and only one as an ambassador. Hence I prefer to record only the ten *strategoi*, and exclude all other elected military officials.⁵

In recording the *rhetores* I follow the definition argued in my former article, and so I include: proposers of *psephismata* in the *ecclesia* or in the *boule*; proposers of *nomoi* before the *nomothetai*; prosecutors and defendants in political public actions; speakers addressing the *ecclesia* or the *boule*; *synegoroi* addressing the *dicasteria* (either for the prosecution or for the defence). Two problems, however, need a more detailed investigation. As to prosecutors, defendants, and *synegoroi*, we must define the concept ‘political public action’; and as to speakers addressing the *ecclesia* and the *boule*, we must decide whether or not to include the ambassadors.

‘Public prosecutors’ in Athens comprised all citizens who brought any public action (δημόσιος ἀγών). But the Athenians had more than fifty different types of public action, ranging from e.g. the public action

for locking up a man on the pretense that he is an adulterer (*γραφὴ ἀδίκως εἰρχθῆναι ως μοιχόν*) to the public action against unconstitutional proposals (*γραφὴ παρανόμων*).⁶ The former action had no direct connection with politics, and in this and many similar public actions the prosecutor would often be one of the relatives or friends of the injured person (who was in this case the detained man).⁷ So within the group of public actions we must look for specifically political types of public action, *i.e.* public actions brought against *rhetores* or *strategoi* in their capacity of being *rhetores* or *strategoi*. The two most obvious types of public action meeting this requirement are the *γραφὴ παρανόμων* (invariably brought against *rhetores*) and the *εἰσαγγελία* (frequently brought against *strategoi* and sometimes against *rhetores*). To the *γραφὴ παρανόμων* (involving *psephismata* passed by the *ecclesia* or the *boule*) must be added the corresponding *γραφὴ νόμου μὴ ἐπιτήδειον θεῖναι* (involving *nomoi* passed by the *nomothetai*), and in addition to the *εἰσαγγελία* we must record applications of the *ἀπόφασις*, introduced *ca* 350 and brought against the same types of offender as the *εἰσαγγελία*, the main difference being that the council of the Areopagos was entrusted with the preliminary investigation. Next, prosecutors and *synegoroi* in the *δοκιμασίᾳ ρητόρων* must be recorded, and so must attested cases of the *προβολή*, when brought against sycophants or against a man who did not fulfill what he had promised the Athenian *demos*; both types of action seem to have been used only infrequently.⁸

Of the *probole* for not fulfilling one's promises to the *demos* (Arist. *Ath. Pol.* 43.5) we have only one attested case, Euboulos' *probole* against Aristophon (Dem. 21.218 with scholia).

What brings together these public actions is not only the fact that they were explicitly aimed at *rhetores* and/or *strategoi*, but also some significant procedural regulations. The *graphe paranomon*, the *eisangelia*, and the *apophasis* were probably the only types of public action for which the *thesmoothetai* could appoint a *dicasterion* manned with more than 500 jurors.⁹ Furthermore, by contrast with other types of public action, these procedures involved the *ecclesia* in the initial phase before the hearing by a *dicasterion*; in the *graphe paranomon* the indictment against the proposer of a decree was often lodged under oath (*ὑπωμοσία*) during the *ecclesia*, either before or after the people had voted on the *psephisma*.¹⁰ In a *graphe nomon me epitedeion theinai*, the *σύνδικοι*, speaking in defence of the *nomos*, might be appointed by the *ecclesia* (Dem. 20.146). The *dokimasia ton rhetoron* was opened by an *ἐπαγγελία* brought in the *ecclesia* (Aeschin. 1.81). The *eisangelia* was brought in the *ecclesia* (Arist. *Ath. Pol.* 43.3) and so was the *probole* (43.5). Finally, the *apophasis* was initiated by a decree of the people ordering the council of the Areopagos to conduct the preliminary investigation and report to the *ecclesia*, which then referred the case to a *dicasterion* (Din. 1.51).

More problematical is whether or not to register known cases of *εὐθυναι*. The *euthynai* apply primarily to *archai* and, apart from speakers in the *boule*, *rhetores* were not *archai*. On the other hand, my inventory includes not only councillors addressing the *boule*, but also *strategoi* and some elected treasurers, who were *archai*, and ambassadors, who by contrast with other *rhetores* (*cf. infra*) had to submit to *euthynai*. It would be misleading to omit *euthynai* of *strategoi*, councillors, and ambassadors, and so these cases of *euthynai* are included, but not instances of *euthynai* against other *archai*. The problem is of surprisingly little practical importance. Although more than 1200 Athenian officials had to submit to *euthynai* every year,¹¹ the sources, covering a period of more than one hundred years, provide us only some ten examples of the *euthynai* resulting in a public action.¹² In the fourth century, there is not a single attested case of *euthynai* against a councillor, and *euthynai* against other officials included in my list amount to one against a general (Pamphilos, 389/8), one against an elected trea-

surer (?) (Lykourgos, 336–324), and two against ambassadors (Epikrates, 394–392; Aischines, 343/2). I have included these examples, and I stress how few they are only to emphasize that the *euthynai* (against *archai* and other officials) were of very little importance by comparison with the *graphe paranomon* and the *eisangelia* against *rhetores* and *strategoi*.

Another problem is raised by the *endeixis* when brought against an *atimos* who exercised his citizen rights. Insofar as the citizen put on trial had only attended a festival or served as a juror or the like, there is no reason to include the *endeixis* in an inventory of *rhetores* and *strategoi*. But if the defendant was an *atimos* who had addressed the *ecclesia* or served on an embassy, the case must be regarded as a ‘political public action’, and the known applications of this form of *endeixis* are accordingly included in the inventory.¹³

This list, I believe, exhausts the ‘political public actions’. There may of course have been others unknown to us, and we must admit further that any public action, and sometimes even private actions, might be misused for political purposes. Antiphon 6, for example, was delivered in a *dike phonou* by a defendant who claims that he has been put on trial for political reasons. But we have no speech for the prosecution, and so we must suspend judgement in this and many similar cases (e.g. the speech *Against Theokrines*, Dem. 58).

Finally, since the types of public action discussed above were brought against *rhetores* and *strategoi* in their capacity of being *rhetores* and *strategoi*, I naturally record not only the prosecutors and their *synegoroi* but also the defendants and the *synegoroi* speaking for the defence.

The next major issue is whether or not to include ambassadors among the *rhetores*. They were elected by the *ecclesia* (occasionally by the *boule*), and so, once appointed, they can no longer be regarded as volunteers. Moreover, by contrast with proposers, public prosecutors, and speakers addressing the political assemblies, the *presbeis* had to submit to *euthynai* after their mission.¹⁴ In these two respects they differ from *rhetores*. On the other hand, they had to make a report on their mission both to the *boule* and to the *ecclesia*. So they were *rhe-*

tores in the legal sense, and subject to be put on trial by an *eisangelia* warranted by the third section of the *νόμος εἰσαγγελτικός*, prescribing an *eisangelia* ἐάν τις . . . ρήτωρ ὃν μὴ λέγῃ τὰ ἄριστα τῷ δῆμῳ τῷ Ἀθηναίων χρήματα λαμβάνων (Hyp. 3.7–8). This is precisely what happened to the four ambassadors sent to Sparta in 392/1. In consequence of their report, Kallistratos brought an *eisangelia* against them, and all were sentenced to death. In 368/7 Timagoras suffered the same fate after his embassy to the king of Persia.¹⁵ But were ambassadors also regarded as *rhetores* in the political sense? Several sources strongly indicate that they were. In the speech *On the Crown* Demosthenes takes pride in telling the jurors that he both moved the decree by which ambassadors were sent to Thebes in 339 and served as an ambassador, thereby surpassing all previous *rhetores* (18.219): καίτοι πολλοὶ παρ’ ὑμῖν, ἄνδρες Ἀθηναῖοι, γεγόνασι ρήτορες ἔνδοξοι καὶ μεγάλοι πρὸ ἐμοῦ, Καλλίστρατος ἐκεῖνος, Ἀριστοφῶν, Κέφαλος, Θρασύβουλος, ἔτεροι μυρίοι· ἀλλ’ ὅμως οὐδεὶς πώποτε τούτων διὰ παντὸς ἔδωκεν ἔαντὸν εἰς οὐδὲν τῇ πόλει, ἀλλ’ ὁ μὲν γράφων οὐκ ἀν ἐπρέσβευσεν, ὁ δὲ πρεσβεύων οὐκ ἀν ἔγραψεν. All four *rhetores* mentioned by Demosthenes did in fact serve on various embassies, and three of them are also known as proposers of decrees. Demosthenes has no intention of emphasizing any subdivision of *rhetores* into two mutually exclusive groups of proposers and ambassadors; his point is that a *rhetor* who had proposed and carried a decree concerning an embassy did not normally serve on the embassy warranted by his decree. On the other hand, he states explicitly that the group of famous *rhetores*, the political leaders, included both proposers of decrees and ambassadors. Aischines takes the same view in his description of Timarchos (1.120, αἰσχύνομαι γὰρ ὑπὲρ τῆς πόλεως, εἰ Τίμαρχος, ὁ τοῦ δήμου σύμβουλος καὶ τὰς εἰς τὴν Ἑλλάδα τολμῶν πρεσβείας πρεσβεύειν κτλ.) and in his description of Demosthenes (3.73, ὁ γὰρ μισαλέξανδρος καὶ μισοφίλιππος ὑμῖν οὐτοσὶ ρήτωρ δις ἐπρέσβευσεν εἰς Μακεδονίαν, ἔξον μηδὲ ἄπαξ κτλ.). What connects the speaker addressing the people or the jurors with the ambassador is the art of rhetoric, and eloquence is often mentioned as essential for being a good ambassador.¹⁶ So ambassa-

dors deserve inclusion in an inventory of *ρήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί*, since they seem to have been regarded as *rhetores*, not only in the legal sense but also in the political sense of the term.

The phrase *ρήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί* seems to cover almost all the important aspects of political leadership in both domestic policy, foreign policy, and military command. There is however one important exception: fiscal policy. In the course of the fourth century the Athenians created some very important financial offices which, like the *strategia*, were filled by election. Most important are *ὁ ταμίας στρατιωτικῶν*, *οἱ ἐπὶ τὸ θεωρικόν*, and *ὁ ἐπὶ τῇ διοικήσει* (attested only for the last years of our period).¹⁷ Euboulos, Demosthenes, Lykourgos, and Demades were all elected to fill one of these offices, but none was ever a *strategos*. The fifth-century merging of *rhetores* and *strategoi* seems to have been replaced, in the period 355–322, by a merging of *rhetores* and elected treasurers. Again, the trend must not be overrated, but in the so-called Lycurgan period, political leadership was often connected with serving as an elected treasurer. Yet the financial officials were neither *rhetores* nor *strategoi*. We do not know how the Athenians reacted to this new change in political leadership. It is not uncommon that a change in political opinion and terminology requires some adaptation and comes later than the change in political institutions. In the *Ath. Pol.* Aristotle devotes only a few lines to the Theoric Board and the treasurer of the military fund (43.1, 47.2, 49.3), and *ὁ ἐπὶ τῇ διοικήσει* is passed over in silence. The orators have a few references to the Theoric Board but none to *ὁ ἐπὶ τῇ διοικήσει*. The democracy was abolished in 322 and at the same time the literary sources stop. The elected financial treasurers were not covered by the terms *ρήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί* or *οἱ πολιτευόμενοι* or *οἱ σύμβοντοι*. But they were certainly ‘political leaders’, and I have recorded the eleven known instances in the inventory.

Athenian citizens who fulfill one or more of these requirements constitute an inventory of 368 persons who were politically active in the sense that they were either *rhetores* or *strategoi* or (in a few cases) elected treasurers. This list, I believe, can provide a more exact basis for addressing questions of the sort mentioned at the beginning of this article.

Inventory: ῥήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί, 403–322 B.C.

The following catalogue of Athenian ‘political leaders’ includes first the name (with patronymic and demotic if known), then the number given in Kirchner’s *Prosopographia Attica* and, if the man is of the liturgical class, reference to Davies’ *Athenian Properties Families*. Broken names are not included. Some of the citizens registered were active before 403 and others after 322, but I record only political activities within the period 403–322.¹⁸ The inventory lists political activities in the following order:

- (1) Proposal of a decree in the *ecclesia*. To move a probouleumatic decree is regarded as one political activity, and so proposers of probouleumatic decrees are recorded only as proposers of decrees in the *ecclesia*, but not in the *boule*.
- (2) Proposal of a decree in the *boule*.
- (3) Proposal of a *nomos* before the *nomothetai*. I believe that all *nomoi* in the fourth century were passed by the *nomothetai*.¹⁹ Accordingly, all proposers of *nomoi* are recorded separately from proposers of *psephismata* in the *ecclesia*, although the *nomothetai* are explicitly mentioned in ten *nomoi* only, seven preserved on stone (of which one is unpublished) and three referred to in literary sources.
- (4) Prosecution in a political public action. These actions comprise the γραφὴ παρανόμων, the γραφὴ νόμου μὴ ἐπιτήδειον θεῖναι, the εἰσαγγελία,²⁰ the ἀπόφασις, the δοκυμασία ρόττορων, the προβολή if brought against sycophants or citizens deceiving the people, the εὐθυναι if brought against *strategoi*, elected treasurers, or ambassadors, and the ἔνδειξις if brought against an *atimos* acting as a *rhetor*.²¹
- (5) Speech delivered in the *ecclesia*. Information about a speech by the proposer of a decree is not recorded separately under this heading, but only under the proposal. For a few major *rhetores*, e.g. Demosthenes and Demades, I have not thought it necessary to record all the possible occasions for speeches delivered in the assembly.²²
- (6) Speech delivered in the *boule*.
- (7) *Synegoria* for the prosecutor or for the defendant.
- (8) Defence in a political public action.
- (9) Mission as an ambassador. To be an ambassador is regarded as one political activity only, and the obligatory reports on the mission to the *boule* and the *ecclesia* are recorded here and not earlier under speeches delivered in the *ecclesia* or the *boule*.

(11) Administration of public money as an elected treasurer. These comprise ὁ ταμίας στρατιωτικῶν, οἱ ἐπὶ τῷ θεωρικόν, and ὁ ἐπὶ τῇ διοικήσει. I do not record the ἐπιμελητὴς τῶν κρηνῶν because this important office was probably technical rather than political, and I omit as well the extraordinary officials, e.g. the *σιτάνης* and the *τειχοποιοί*.

The references to the sources are fairly complete but not exhaustive. Especially for some decrees and public actions frequently referred to in literary sources, it would be pointless in this context to print all references. For most of the political public actions full documentation is given in my monographs cited under (4) *supra*. For the decrees I must ask the reader to await the completion of my Inventory of decrees of 403–322 B.C. mentioned in literary sources.

- Αθηνόδωρος (*PA* 259+260). Proposes two decrees of the people: (1) honours for Iphitos, 394–387 (*IG* II² 26.6–7); (2) concerning the Asklepieion, *init. s. iv* (*IG* II² 47.23).
- Αἰσυμος (*PA* 311). Addresses the *ecclesia*, 397/6 (*Hell.Oxy.* 6.2). Ambassador to (1) Chios in 384/3 (*IG* II² 34.36–37), (2) Methymna in 378/7 (*IG* II² 42.19–20).
- Αἰσχίνης (*PA* 333). Ambassador to Thessaly, 361/0 (?) (*IG* II² 175.3).
- Αἰσχίνης Ἀτρομήτου Κοθωκίδης (*PA* 354, *APF*). Brings an *epangelia* against Timarchos, 346/5 (Aeschin. 1.81); attempts to bring an *eisangelia* (no. 110) against Demosthenes, 343 (?) (3.223–24); brings a *graphe paranomon* (no. 30) against Ktesiphon, 330/329 (3.8). Elected *syndikos* in the Delian affair, 343 (?) (Dem. 18.134). Addresses the *ecclesia* frequently (Dem. 18.136, 140, 285; 19.10, 35, 113, 209, 304, 310, as well as his reports to the *boule* and *ecclesia* in his capacity as ambassador). Defendant in an *euthynai* charged with *parapresbeia*, 343/2 (Dem. 19.2, 103, 211). Ambassador (1) to Arcadia in 348/7 (?) (Aeschin. 2.79), (2) three times to Philip in

Γνάθων Λακιάδης (not in *PA*). Proposes a decree of the people of unknown content, *init. s. iv* (*Hesperia* 26 [1957] 207 no. 53); for the demotic see *Hesperia* 52 (1983) 106 no. 1.ii.e.8.

Δεινίας Ἐρχιεύς (*PA* 3163, *APF*). *Syndikos* elected to defend Leptines' law, 355/4 (Dem. 20.146).

Δεινοκράτης Κλεομβρότου Ἄχαρνεύς (*PA* 3181+3185, *APF*). *Strategos*, 336/5 (*IG II²* 1628.351, 370; 1629.871, 890).

Δεινόστρατος Δεινιάδου Ἅγκυλῆθην (*PA* 3191+3192). Proposes in the *boule* an honorary decree for Phanodemos, 343/2 (*IG II²* 223A.4).

Δέρκυλος Αὐτοκλέους Ἀγνούστιος (*PA* 3248+3249, *APF*). Ambassador to Philip three times in 347/6 (Aeschin. 2.47; Dem. 19.175; Aeschin. 2.140).

- Κτησικλῆς Βατήθεν** (*PA* 8868). Proposes in the *boule* an honorary decree for Lykourgos, before 324 (*IG* II² 3207, cf. *supra Δημέας Σφήττιος*).
- Κτησικῶν** (*PA* 8893). Addresses the *ecclesia* in support of a conclusion of peace with Philip, 347/6 (Dem. 19.12). Ambassador (1) to Philip, 348/7 (Aeschin. 2.12); (2) to Philip three (?) times, 347/6 (1: Aeschin. 2.42; 2 [?] Dem. 19.163–65; 3 [?]: Dem. 19.121).

Λυσικράτης Οἰναῖος (*PA* 9465). Ambassador to Thrace, 356/5 (*IG* II² 127.36).

Λυσίστρατος (*PA* 9598). *Strategos*, 366/5 (?) (Xen. *Vect.* 3.7).

Μανίας Μαντιθέου Θορίκιος (*PA* 9667, *APF*). *Strategos*, 360/359 (Diod. 16.2.6).

Μανίθεος (*PA* 9674, cf. *APF* 364). Addresses the *ecclesia*, ca 400 (Lys. 16.20).

Μειδίας Κηφισοδώρου Ἀναγυράσιος (*PA* 9719, *APF*). Proposes some *nomoi* concerning the cavalry, 349/8 (Dem. 21.173; Goodwin *ad loc.* suggests that Meidias, as a hipparch, procured the enactment of laws he did not personally propose). Addresses the *ecclesia* (1) accusing the retiring *boule*, 356/5 (Dem. 22.10); accusing the *hippeis*, 349/8 (Dem. 21.197); (3) on numerous other occasions (Dem. 21.153, 202). Μενέξενος (*PA* 9972). Proposes two decrees of the people: (1) amendment to honours for Straton of Sidon, 364/3 (?) (*IG* II² 141.29); (2) repayment to Athens of a debt of 3 talents, before 363/2 (*IG* II² 111.8–9).

Ambassador to Philip three (?) times, 347/6 (1: Dem. 19 hypoth. 2.4; 2 [?]: Dem. 19.163–65; 3 [?]: Dem. 19.121). *Strategos*, 353/2 (Diod. 16.37.3); before 334/3 (*IG* II² 1623.329–30).
- Νεοπτόλεμος Σκύριος** (*PA* 10647). Addresses the *ecclesia* in support of peace with Philip, 347/6 (Dem. 19.12, 315).
- Νικήρατος Νικίου Κυδαντίδης** (*PA* 10742, *APF*). *Tamias stratiotikon*, 345/4 or 344/3 (*IG* II² 1443.13).
- Νικόμαχος** (*PA* 10934). Defendant in an *eisangelia* (no. 140), 399/8 (Lys. 30).
- Νικομένης** (*PA* 10968). Proposes in the *ecclesia* (?) a decree (*nomos*?) about citizenship, 403/2 (?) (schol. Aeschin. 1.39; cf. *GRBS* 20 [1979] 38).
- Νικόστρατος Θοραιεύς** (*PA* 11029). Ambassador to Olynthos, 376/5 (*IG* II² 36.4).
- Νικοφῶν** (not in *PA*). Proposes a *nomos* on silver coinage, 375/4 (*Hesperia* 43 [1974] 157–88).
- Νόθιππος Λυσίου Διομειεύς** (*PA* 11131). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an honorary decree for Rheboulas, 331/0 (*IG* II² 349.9–10).
- Ξενόδοκος Ἀχαρνεύς** (*PA* 11192). Ambassador to Byzantium, 378/7 (*IG* II² 41.19).
- Ξενοκλείδης** (*PA* 11197). Addresses the *ecclesia* opposing Kallistratos, 370/369 (Dem. 59.26–27).
- Ξενοκλῆς Ξεινίδος Σφήττιος** (*PA* 11234, *APF*). ὁ ἐπὶ τῇ διοικήσει, ca 330 (?) (*Hesperia* 29 [1960] 2–4 no. 3).
- Ὦρθοβούλος ἐκ Κεραμέων** (*PA* 11489). Ambassador to Byzantium, 378/7 (*IG* II² 41.17).
- Πάμφιλος Εὐφυλήτου Κηφισιεύς** (*PA* 11531, *APF*). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an amendment to an honorary decree for Euphron, 323/2 (*IG* II² 448.31).
- Πάμφιλος Ἄχερδοντος** (*PA* 11540). Brings an *eisangelia* (no. 143) against Timarchos, 361/0 (Aeschin. 1.109–12).
- Πάμφιλος Κειριάδης** (*PA* 11545, *APF*). Defendant in an *euthynai* (?), 389/8 (?) (Ar. *Plut.* 174–75 with schol.; Plat Com. fr.14 K.; Dem. 40.20, 22). *Strategos*, 390/389, 389/8 (Xen. *Hell.* 5.1.2).

- Πολίαγρος** (*PA* 11893). Proposes a decree of the people concerning Klazomenai, 387/6 (*IG* II² 28.3).

Πολύχαρμος (*PA* 12105). Addresses the *ecclesia* regularly, 4th c. (?) (*Plut. Mor.* 726B).

Προκλείδης Πανταλέοντος ἐκ Κεραμέων (*PA* 12200). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an honorary decree for Androkles, 328/7 (*IG* II² 354.8–9).

Προκλῆς (*PA* 12208). Elected prosecutor in the *apophasis* in consequence of the Harpalos affair, 324/3 (*Plut. Mor.* 846C).

Πρόξενος Ἀρμοδίου Ἀφιδναῖος (*PA* 12270, *APF*). Defendant in an *apophasis*, 346–343 (Dem. 19.280 and schol., Din. 1.63). *Strategos*, 349/8 (*IG* II² 207d.23); 347/6 (Aeschin. 2.133); 339/8 (Polyaen. 4.2.8).

Πυθέας (*PA* 12342). Elected prosecutor in the *apophasis* in consequence of the Harpalos affair, 324/3 (*Plut. Mor.* 846C, Dem. Ep. 3.29, Pytheas fr.iii). Ρίνων Χαρικλέους Παιανιεύς (*PA* 12532, *APF*). *Strategos*, 403/2 (Arist. *Ath. Pol.* 38.4).

Σάτυρος (*PA* 12575). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an honorary decree for Menelaos, 363/2 (*IG* II² 110.6, 20).

Σκίτων (not in *PA*). Proposes a decree of the people, before 347 (Dem. 21.182). Defendant in a *graphe paranomon* (no. 19), before 347 (Dem. 21.182).

Σμίκρος (not in *PA*). Proposes a decree of the people, before 347 (Dem. 21.182). Defendant in a *graphe paranomon* (no. 20), before 347 (Dem. 21.182).

Σπονδίας (*PA* 12861). *Strategos*, 368/7 (*IG* II² 104.3).

Στέφανος (*PA* 12879). Proposes a decree of the people concerning a water-pipe, after 336 (Din. fr.xviii Con.). Defendant in a *graphe paranomon* (no. 33), after 336 (Din.).

Στέφανος (not in *PA*). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an alliance with Thebes, 378/7 (*IG* II² 40.4 [*Staatsvertr.* II 255]).

Στέφανος Ἀντιδωρίδον Ἐροιάδης (*PA* 12887). Proposes in the *ecclesia* an alliance with Mytilene, 347/6 (*IG* II² 213.5). Regularly moves decrees on behalf of others (Dem. 59.43). This inventory of 368 politically active Athenian citizens raises a methodological question: does the catalogue, as it purports, include all *known* Athenian citizens who volunteered as *rhetores* or were elected *strategoi* or treasurers? Not quite, and I append a list of citizens who, in the literary sources, are called *politeuomenoi* or *symbouloī* or are described in another way as *rhetores*, but are never once attested as having performed one of the listed political activities:

This list shows that an inventory based on attested political activities cannot be complete, owing to the scattered nature of our attestations. Complete

sources would probably lead to the inclusion of all eleven citizens listed above, and of many others as well, but this problem will be reserved for a future study of the number of Athenian *ρήτορες καὶ στρατηγοί*.²⁴

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
